There is a hunger in society today, pangs more gnawing than perhaps at any other time in history. This hunger is intensified by the frustration about “fake news.” It seeps through the lyrics of popular songs like, “How can I be sure”. It registers in the widespread skepticism over the rhetoric from politicians of every stripe. It appears in the disbelief at each new act of terror or mass shooting. This hunger is demonstrated by people's fast flight to fantasy in the theater with rebooted fairy tales, science fiction and witchcraft.

What is that hunger? It is a hunger for simple truth. People want to know where they belong in the world. Theories about human life that involve billions of years do not provide a post to which to hitch your pony. Sports and entertainment can only divert us for so long until the pangs return. Where did I come from? What am I doing here in the world? What's going to happen to me when I die?

There is only one satisfying food for the soul's hunger for truth. And that's Easter. Easter is the only assurance we have in this changing world that there's still such a thing as absolute

truth and there's still a place to find it. Easter proves that God always keeps his word. Thousands of years of God's promises to his people culminated at the empty tomb. Every prophetic word of God's Old Testament Scripture was fulfilled there in Joseph's lovely garden. Jesus' claim that he is “the Truth” was declared bona fide when the angel rolled away the stone.

So, if you want to know the truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the truth, Easter is the only place to find it. If your soul suffers from pangs of hunger for the truth, Easter is the place to eat and be filled. If you are plagued by guilt, Easter is the visible sign that God accepted the sacrifice Jesus made on your behalf. If you feel lonely and alone, trust the risen Son who promised to be with you till the end. If you sense that nobody listens to you or cares how you feel, believe the truth that whatever you ask the Father in the name of his risen Son, he will give it to you.

If you are hungry for the truth, eat Easter.

This is my first report to you following election to the office of President of the congregation. It is a privilege to serve the Lord and Redeemer in this responsibility. I am committed to invest the time and talent God has entrusted to me to fulfill this trust.

First, we thank Mark Hixson for serving as president to begin the challenging transition to a new organization structure and revised set of by-laws and we thank our departed brother Dick Karkau for serving many years as the congregation treasurer. Our congregation has been blessed by their service. We are also thankful that Doug Willis has been elected to serve as the new treasurer of the congregation.

God has given Redeemer Lutheran many mission and ministry opportunities to consider in the coming months and years. We have also been blessed with the resources needed to pursue them. Our emphasis in ministry planning will be to faithfully use these resources, both talent and financial, to advance God's kingdom within the Redeemer fellowship and through outreach.

Each of the elected boards is working to develop ministry plans in their respective areas to take advantage of these opportunities. As an example, a proposal was recently presented to the congregation to increase the ministry reach in the preschool. The proposal was approved and implementation plans have begun, including a call for a new teacher. The board of education will be keeping the congregation informed regarding the progress of this ministry growth initiative.

In addition, the council is planning a retreat at the end of April to begin a process to identify and prioritize overall mission and ministry opportunities for Redeemer and to develop a coordinated strategy to pursue them. We will be sharing the outcome of this effort with the congregation in regular open forums in the near future. The goal is to keep the congregation abreast of ministry plans as they are being discussed and pursued by the boards and the council. The forums will encourage input from all members of the congregation through questions and suggestions. Before any proposal is brought to the voters for approval, it is the intent of the council that the congregation will be well informed with a good understanding of the issue.

It will not be long before the process of preparing for the next fiscal year will again be upon us. Members will be needed to participate on the budget and nominations committees and to accept nominations for the council and ministry boards. I pray that there will be ample volunteers willing to serve in these roles. *"Therefore, my dear brothers, stand firm. Let nothing move you. Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your labor will not be in vain."* 1 Corinthians 15:58

As a final note, the vacancies on the council that prompted the recent mid-term elections identified a gap in the by-laws. The by-laws are now being reviewed to propose a resolution to that issue and consider any other proposed revisions. The proposed changes will be communicated to the congregation for questions and discussion prior to a call for a voters meeting.

As I write these notes we have completed the Lenten season and celebrated the joy of the Easter resurrection of Jesus. I pray that we will all carry that joy forward as we serve our Lord in kingdom work at Redeemer.



### L O G O R E D E S I G N

The current logo has served Redeemer well as a distinctive symbol of our congregation. Then, why should we consider a change? One reason to consider a change to our logo is the limitations of the current logo.

With all its variant colors, our current logo is :

- very expensive to print
- hard to reproduce on shirts
- hard to reproduce on banners

Also, marketing professionals have explained to us that our logo may translate well to existing Christians, but may not with the unchurched people in our community who we are trying to reach.

As Redeemer continues to grow we are looking to have a logo that represents Redeemer **and** translates to the community that we are in. We continue to make strides to reach the people in the community around us with the Word of God. A new logo and branding, will help both church and school in that regard.

Our goal is to have something that is attractive to the people in the community around us and that symbolizes who we are and what we offer. We have a working tagline of “Grow With Us”. This theme describes all three phases of our ministry (Church, Early Childhood Education, Grade School) it represents Redeemer well **and** extends an invitation to our community.

Once the graphic designers have collected information about Redeemer they will draft several designs. Three designs will be presented to the congregation for feedback. We hope to have these designs ready to show by the end of May.




