
SECURITY

Chairman's Report

The annual Voters' meeting was held September 20. At this meeting, the fiscal year budget for 2015/2016 was adopted and elections were held. James

Caldwell was re-elected as Christian Care Elder, Dick Karkau as Finance Elder, and Mark Hixson was elected as Communication Elder, taking over for Dan Casmer whose term expired. We want to thank Dan for his service during the past 3 years; he has spent significant time working to get our archives in order and readily accessible electronically. We welcome Mark Hixson and offer our prayers for his work in this position and thanks for his willingness to serve. The Voters also approved the continuation of the existing organization structure while a congregational ministry plan is developed. Changes to the organization structure that will support that plan will be presented at a future date.

As mentioned in the previous newsletter, the Moore Road property has been sold; closing occurred August 28 after a number of delays while the buyer's final paperwork was completed.

Thrivent has established a new grant program that may prove to be beneficial for many of the projects that occur at Redeemer during the year. This program has great potential, but needs a Thrivent member to serve to coordinate the program operation. The council is still seeking a Thrivent member to serve as a coordinator for this program. If you are a Thrivent member and are interested in serving in this capacity, please contact James Caldwell, our Christian Care Elder, Ben Weinstein, Jim Rockwell, or myself and we will provide additional information.

Redeemer is part of the Arizona Lutheran Academy federation; we were approached by the ALA board regarding a unique opportunity for ALA to acquire land adjacent to the campus that will extend the

property to Southern Avenue. Thanks to all who have donated in support of this. The donation goal was met; however, donations will continue to be accepted. Another \$10,000 in matching funds has been offered by an anonymous donor. This opportunity for ALA is extraordinary, the property adjacent to the school will carry its footprint to Southern Avenue, an opportunity many have been praying for over the past years.

During the month of October, the Redeemer Elders will be participating in training and planning meetings for the WELS Christian Care in Congregations (CCC) program. This program will be used as a springboard to create a ministry plan for Redeemer.

Redeemer has been blessed with many visitors worshipping with us. Please take the opportunity to introduce yourself and make our visitors feel welcome.




A Z T A X C R E D I T / S T O N E W S
