*Galatians 5:1 - "It is for freedom that Christ has set us free. Stand firm, then, and do not let yourselves be burdened again by a yoke of slavery."*

Talking about your freedoms and your rights is as American as apple pie. We are proud of the freedoms we have. We are proud that there are laws protecting against discrimination and racism. We are proud of the freedoms of speech, religion, assembly, press, etc. In fact, we have so many freedoms in America that we are prone to taking them for granted. These freedoms are ones that need to be valued and not taken for granted.

Well, there's a parallel there to our faith. Through faith in Jesus we have been freed from slavery to sin, death, and the devil. We are proud of those freedoms, and yet, as it is easy to take our American freedoms for granted, it is easy to take the freedom we have through faith for granted as well. But there's a far greater danger in taking our spiritual freedoms for granted: becoming enslaved all over again!

Paul was writing these words to the Galatians, who were

struggling with the question; are they saved by grace alone, or grace plus works? Did they still have to keep the Old Testament ceremonial laws? In still trying to keep the ceremonial laws they were mixing grace and works, which ends up being by works. They were falling back into work righteousness. Paul says strongly, "do not let yourselves be burdened again by a yoke of slavery."

We are saved by grace alone. Yet when we take the freedoms we have in Christ for granted it is easy to be enslaved all over again. We do well to take this to heart in our daily struggle against sin. It's easy to tell ourselves whatever pet sin we struggle with "isn't that big of a deal", but sin is a big deal, so fight against every sin in your life. Remember your baptism daily and drown your sinful nature. As Paul says to the Corinthians, "You were washed, you were sanctified, you were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and by the Spirit of our God." (6:11) This 4<sup>th</sup> of July celebrate your freedoms as an American, but even more importantly, celebrate the freedom you have from sin, death, and the devil through Jesus' life, death, and resurrection to life again.

## REDEEMER STAFF

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As referenced in last month's newsletter, the church council met for a ministry planning retreat in early May. One Bible passage included in the opening devotion provided clear guidance for our discussions: "Commit your activities to the Lord and your plans will be established," Proverbs 16:3. A review of the importance of effective leadership preceded the discussion of the ministry planning which focused on Jesus' mission to make disciples of all nations. Our ministry opportunities at Redeemer are many and include shepherding our worshiping members with outreach to straying members, visitors, and to school children and their families. To be successful, each of these ministries will require the availability of appropriate resources of time and financial support.

It is often said that planning is the easy step and the hard work begins with organizing the execution of the plan. Each of the boards is now in the process of identifying specific activities and drivers in their respective areas of ministry with reports to be presented at the June council meeting. Strategies and plan building will follow in the coming months.

In the administrative arena, there are a couple of initiatives being investigated. One is to develop a business manager position to reduce the administrative burden on the pastors and school principal. An outline of the position has been prepared and is being reviewed. Another initiative involves a move to QuickBooks accounting software and an effort to reformat the financial reports to make them easier to communicate. Thirdly, a revision to the by-laws is being proposed to address some gaps in a couple of areas. These initiatives have been reviewed in the May council meeting with a plan to hold an Open Forum to discuss them with the congregation in June.

Ministry is a congregational privilege and is not reserved for elected leadership alone. We all are given gifts of grace by God for his Kingdom work as indicated in Romans 12:4. "For as in one body we have many members and the members do not all have the same function, so we, though many, are one body in Christ, and individually members of one another." I pray all of us will look forward to fulfilling the ministry that God has presented to us at Redeemer.

For anyone new to this concept, usually twice a year Redeemer holds this popular event. People who do not like to "yard sale" or have useable items they would like to donate bring their wares to Redeemer the Sunday afternoon before the exchange. With lots of help, the items are sorted by category and put out on tables. During the event itself, anyone is welcome to come in and pick items they could use or would simply like to have. You do not need to bring items to take items and there is no charge for anything. Members of Redeemer Church and School, our sister churches, families and friends, neighbors and co-workers are welcome to come. You can invite anyone you please. We do not advertise this openly to the public so that "collectors" and professional swap-meeting people do not come and raid the place of items they can sell. That is not the purpose of this event. It is for fun and socialization and finding treasures you might not have even known you wanted or needed.

What type of items are donated? Just about anything one could use: Books, pictures, videos, CDs and DVDs; office supplies and equipment; yard and home tools and supplies; pet supplies; house wares and linens; decorative items; clothing, handbags, jewelry and unused make-up still in the containers. Children's clothing and toys are especially popular!! Pots and pans, cooking ware; small appliances; rugs and wall hangings; even smaller pieces of furniture. If you have a large item you are hoping to find a new home for, bring a picture and description to post with info on how to contact you—e.g. pianos, entertainment centers, and the like.

Oh, and to sweeten the deal, we serve food throughout so you can shop and snack, sit at a table and visit with new and old friends, or simply graze. We will soon have a sign up sheet for volunteers to staff the Ministry Center from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Mon and Tues and 7 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Wed. 

Our enrollment for next school year is looking very strong. We have about 75-80 enrolled in preschool and about 110-112 in kindergarten through 8<sup>th</sup> grade. These numbers typically grow in the summer months especially in preschool, and so we wait with eager expectation to see what the final numbers will be when we start school on August 14<sup>th</sup>. God has certainly blessed our plans in working with all of these families and our plans are seeing success. To God be the glory!

All of these students mean that we need to do some rearranging of the classrooms. Since we are moving big furniture, we are planning to splash some paint on the walls as well. The dates for this work are not quite set in stone, but please stay tuned. We would greatly appreciate any muscles and artistic skills you can provide.


